

Spring Feasts of the LORD

Ex 12:1 – 12 First Passover in Egypt	The beginning of months for you. This is to be the first month. On the tenth day, take a lamb according to the number of people in the household. Unblemished male, one year old, from the sheep or the goats. Keep it until the fourteenth day, kill it at twilight. Put blood on the doorposts and lintel with hyssop branches. Eat the flesh roasted (whole) with fire, the same night. Any left over the next day is not to be eaten, but burned with fire. Eat it with unleavened bread and bitter herbs. Eat it in haste, with your loins girded, sandals on your feet, staff in your hand. It is a memorial feast to YHVH, you are to celebrate it in all your generations. It is a permanent ordinance.
Ex 12: 15 – 20 Unleavened Bread	Sabbath on 1 st and 7 th day. No work except to prepare what is to be eaten. You shall remove all the leaven from your homes. You shall eat Unleavened Bread. You shall not eat anything leavened.
Lev 23: 5 – 8 Unleavened Bread	In the first month, on the 14 th day at twilight is YHVH's Passover. Then on the 15 th day of the month is the Feast Of Unleavened Bread. For 7 days you shall eat Unleavened Bread. 1 st day: convocation. No laborious work. For seven days you shall bring and offering by fire. Seventh day, holy convocation, no laborious work.
Num 9:9 – 14 2 nd Passover	If a man is on a long journey, or unclean because of the dead, he must observe in the second month on the fourteenth day at twilight. If he does not, he is to be cut off from his people. The alien sojourning among you may celebrate it.
Lev 23: 9 – 14 First Fruits	When you enter the Land that YHVH gives you (Israel) you are to bring a sheaf of the first fruits of your harvest. The priest will wave the first fruit sheaf before YHVH. Offer a Male lamb 1 yr old without defect, burnt offering. Offer grain offering, mixed with oil, burnt offering. Do not eat fresh grain until this offering has been made. Day after the Sabbath.
Lev 23: 15 – 21 Feast of Weeks Pentecost	Count 7 complete Sabbaths after the first day after the Sabbath after the 15 th of Abib. (Fifty Days.) New grain offering to YHVH. Bring two loaves of bread to the priest as a wave offering. The bread should be made with leaven. Burnt Offering: seven one year old male lambs without defect, and a bull of the herd, and two rams; they are to be a burnt offering to the LORD, with their grain offering and their libations, an offering by fire of a soothing aroma to the LORD. You shall also offer one male goat for a sin offering and two male lambs one year old for a sacrifice of peace offerings. The priest shall then wave them with the bread of the first fruits for a wave offering with two lambs before the LORD; they are to be holy to the LORD for the priest. No laborious work.

2006 dates:

It's a bit confusing trying to translate between the Sacred calendar and the world's calendar.

Sighting of the new moon AND the abib barley March 30. Count 14 days...

Passover will be April 13 @ twilight.

Unleavened Bread (First night) starts immediately afterward at dark.

Unleavened Bread (Seventh Night) April 20. Ends at dark on the 20th.

Sabbath April 15th.

First Fruits April 16th. Begin counting the Omer.

Feast of Weeks (Shavuot, Pentecost) June 4.
